



(c) Definition of homeless individual includes the following:

1. An individual who lacks a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence; and
2. An individual who has a primary nighttime residence that is:
 - (i) A supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations, including welfare facilities;

(e) School and health records

- (i) A homeless parent/guardian and student may "walk-in" without transcript/grade records. If no enrollment is established with administrative personnel, contact the former school about immunization information and tentative placement. They should then request a 30-day in-state or a 90-day out-of-state extension certificate for immunization from the Superintendent or a designee. If it is determined that no records are available or exist, the local school should create a cumulative record folder in accordance with established guidelines. School administrative personnel should obtain a simple release from the parent to facilitate release of the information.
