

Voters Reject the

the Ballot Initiative Process

Our poll finds that Mississippi voters also thoroughly reject the State Supreme Court issuing rulings that jeopardize the state's ballot initiative process. Nearly three-quarters of voters (73%) say they oppose permitting the court to "overturn ballot initiatives voters have already approved," including a solid majority (59%) who *strongly* oppose such actions. Opposition to the court overturning initiatives that voters have already approved includes majorities of Democrats (76% oppose), Republicans (71% oppose) and independents (73% oppose).
